### Selected projects

#### **South Lake Union Innovation District**

Seattle, Washington USA 2000-present



One of the largest urban revitalisation projects in the North America, South Lake Union is a 40-hectare dynamic mixed- use community comprising of bio-technology firms, university and private sector medical research institutions, a mix of affordable and market-rate housing, and tech-based commercial office buildings with diverse retail offerings.

A former industrialised area on the northern edge of downtown Seattle, Washington, South Lake Union has transformed into one of the world's leading innovation hubs and is now home to tech giants including Amazon.com, Google, Facebook, Microsoft, and Alphabet that intermix with the precincts bio-technology firms such as Seattle Biomedical Research Institute. Fred Hutchinson Cancer Research Centre, University of Washington Medical Centre, and the Allen Institute for Brain Science.

Jason supported the project as Senior Project Manager supervising all aspects of development projects including master planning, contracts, feasibility studies, budgeting, entitlements, design and construction oversight. Jason also served as the lead innovation, place and sustainability advisor working closely with the public sector on research and policy measures to support implementation of innovative infrastructure new technology solutions. South Lake Union has become one of the world leading innovation districts demonstrating how wellstructured public private partnership can lead to ecologically, socially and economically successful urban precincts.



### Waterloo State Significant Precinct

Sydney NSW



Catalysed by the State's investment in a new metro station, the Waterloo State Significant Precinct is one of the largest urban regeneration projects in Sydney's history comprising an area of over 20 hectares of government owned land in the Waterloo community in southern Sydney.

With an existing stock of over 2000 social housing units, the precinct is being master planned to redevelopment 2300 new social housing units with an additional yield of 4500 new affordable, intermediate and market rate dwellings. Since 2017, Jason has served as an urban strategist for the project focusing on innovation in retail, placemaking, sustainability, housing and design. To steer the design and stakeholder group, Jason devised a world leading set of principles and performance metrics to guide the project through planning, design, construction and operations.

#### **Hunter Park**

Newcastle, NSW



Hunter Park considers the regeneration of the existing 63ha Broadmeadow Sports Precinct in Greater Newcastle currently owned and managed by Venues NSW and the Department of Industry (Crown Land). The proposal considers the regeneration of the existing stadium, event centre and showground assets into a mixed-use precinct integrated with hotel, retail, commercial office, event space and over 3000 residential apartments to realise a new 365-day-a-year destination within the Hunter region.

Jason served as an advisor to Hunter and Central Coast Development Corporation and Venues New South Wales supporting the overall urban regeneration strategy for housing, retail, commercial and placemaking taking precedence for the international movement toward stadiumled urban regeneration business models.
